

# Roger's best ever whiting rig off the beach

When I consistently out fish other fisherman I am often asked what I am doing. This is the exact rig that I use, and fresh beach worms of course!

## Instructions

This whiting rig is really all you need. For my main line I use 4kg Mono.

Having **the whole rig as fluorocarbon** makes a big difference. I have been fishing next to other beach fishers, when I am getting heaps of bites and pulling in fish every cast.

This is not happening for them. They are using the same bait, fishing in the same spot, but just not catching as many fish as me.

I put it down to my rig and the fluorocarbon.

I generally use a size 1 or 1/0 long shank hook. When I am using large worms for Mulloway I use a 3/0 long shank. I still catch whiting on the larger hook as well.

This rig is just as good on Bream, Australian Salmon, and many other fish species that love worms.

The reason that I use two hooks is because;

1. If you get a bite and miss the fish, you get a second chance because you still have another bait ready.
2. Double hook ups are common and exciting.

## Changing sinker weights

I use a star sinker because you can hold your position when there is current. I used to use a ball sinker but I don't find it an advantage to roll around. It is definitely more enjoyable when you hold position in the surf.

Using a snap swivel on your star sinker enables you to easily adjust the weight of your sinker to suit the conditions.

In calmer surf conditions, switch to a lighter sinker. Use a heavier sinker for rough surf.

To save time, you can pre-make rigs at home, enabling you to start fishing straight away when you get to the beach.
